

In the summer of 2015, the VMA gave a concert in the main lobby of Massachusetts General Hospital, forever changing the academic curriculum of The Peabody Institute of The Johns Hopkins University:

"I was a cancer patient undergoing a clinical trial treatment at Mass General in Boston. One day, after a particularly difficult treatment, I heard music coming from somewhere in the hospital. I followed the sound and came upon your wonderful concert in the lobby. It was such a meaningful moment for me as a musician to hear music from a patient's perspective that it inspired me to start this project at my school a year later . . . THANK YOU for the most transformative gift your concert gave to me!"

That project became the Peabody String Sinfonia:

"The Peabody String Sinfonia is a student-led, conductor-less string orchestra whose mission is to bring healing and beauty to people in our Baltimore community who are in challenging situations or in places where they cannot easily gain access to live music, including cancer treatment, incarceration, homelessness, hospitalization, addiction, and hunger. Our members are students and alumni of the Peabody Conservatory of Music who volunteer their time for this project."


